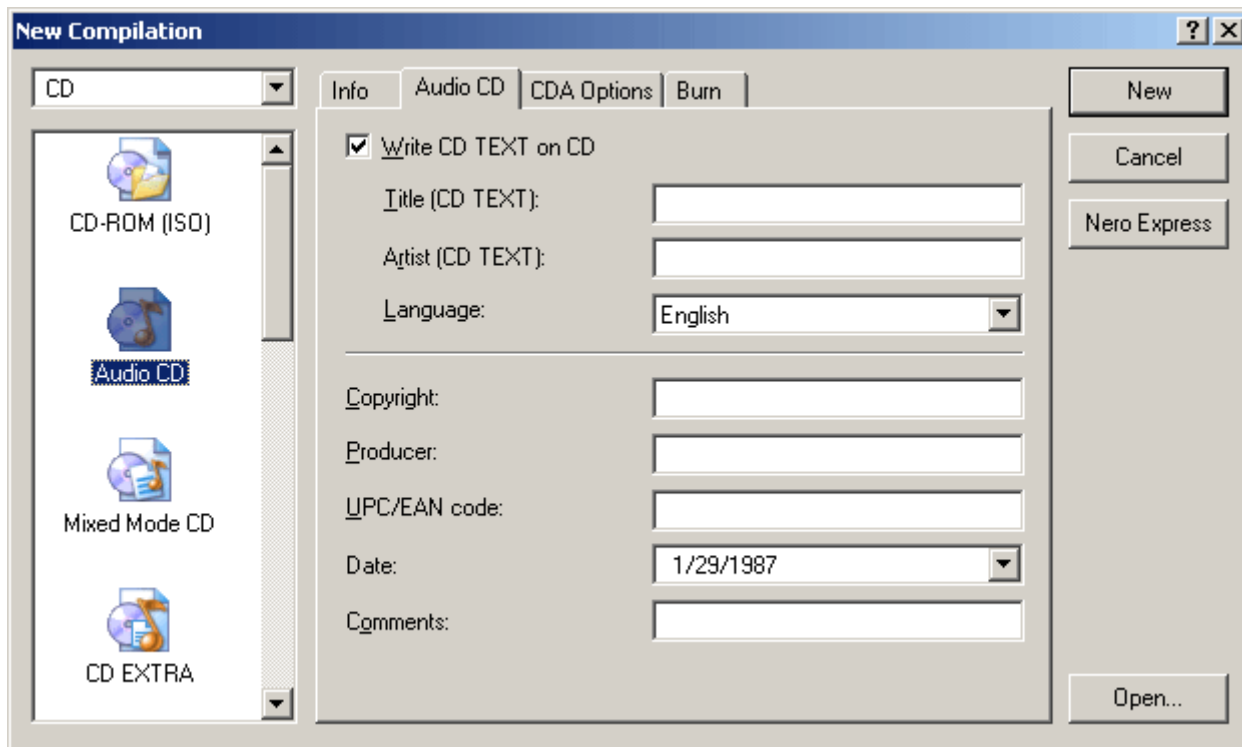
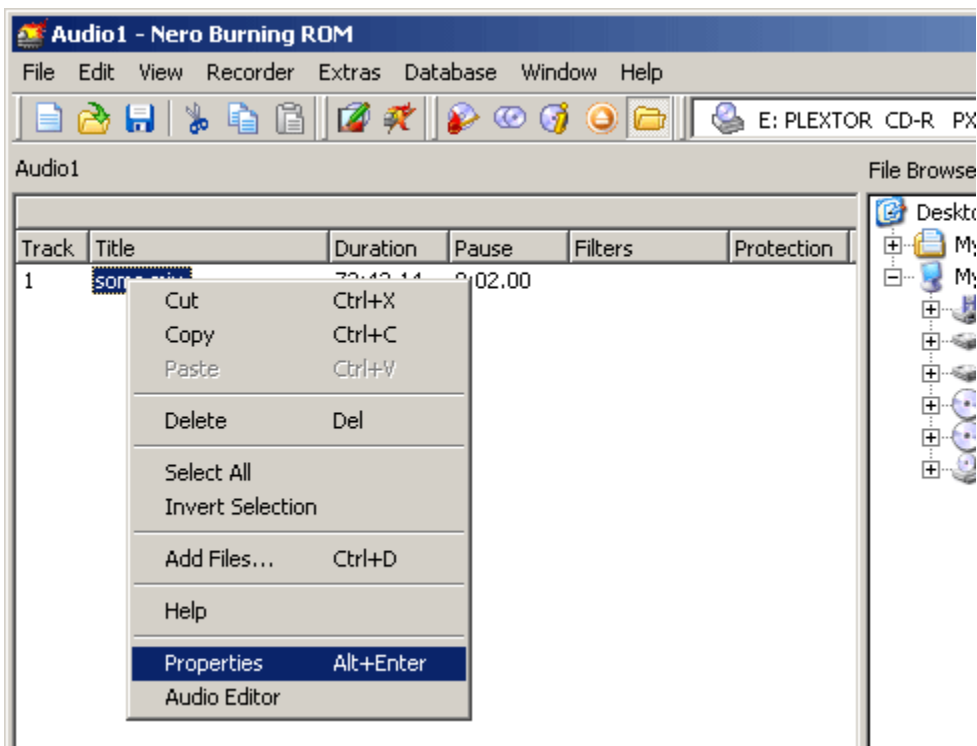


How to split and burn your continuous mix cd with NERO:

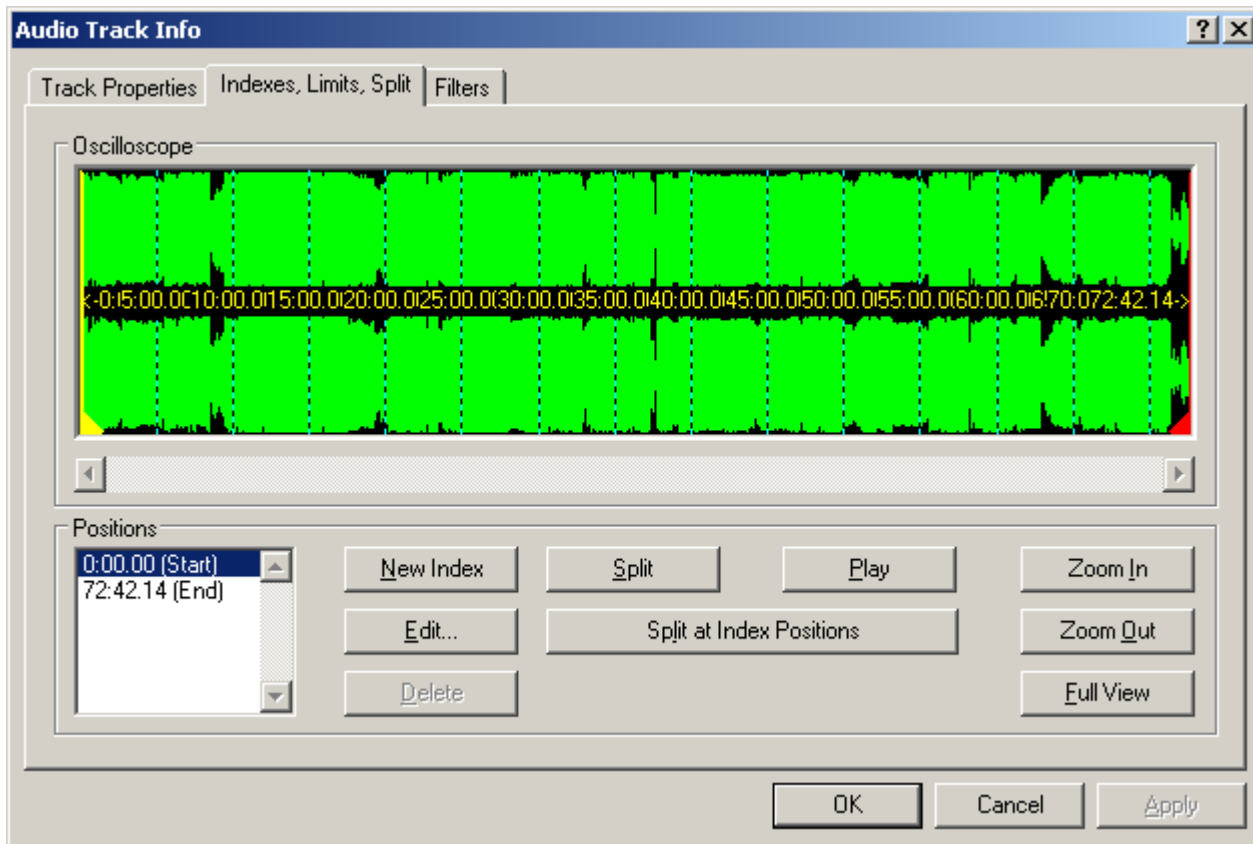
1. Open NERO and create a **new audio cd** compilation.



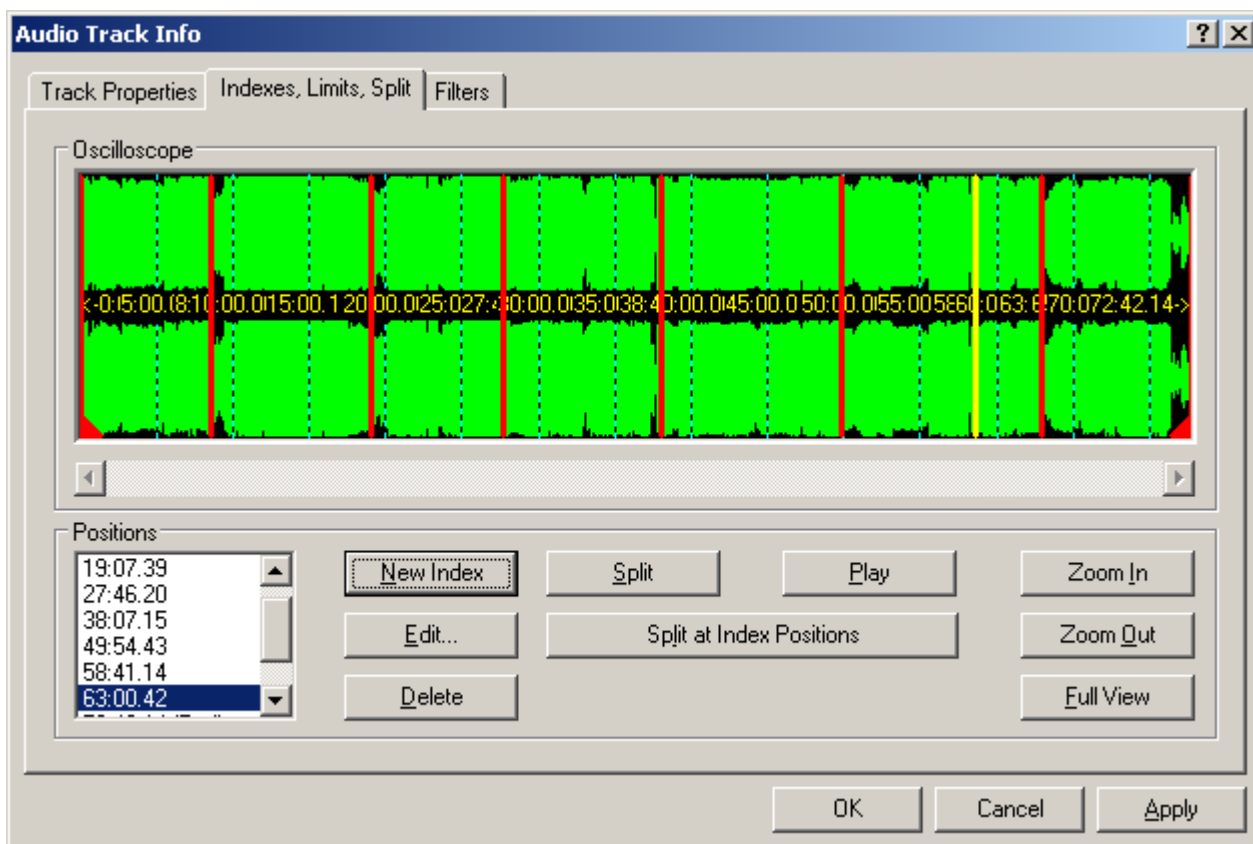
2. **Find your mix** (saved as a .wav or .aif or .mp3 file) on your hard drive and proceed to drag and drop it into your compilation. Now **right click** on your mix (which appears as one track in your NERO compilation) and **select "properties"**.



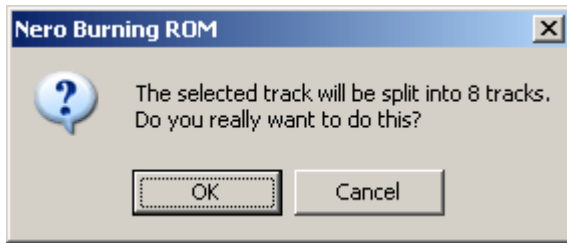
3. **Select the Indexes, limits, split tab** of the properties window (you might need to wait a few minutes while the program draws in the waveform). In this window is where you will make your splits.



First hit the **play button** to find the spots which you want to place your indexes, **you can also click (once) anywhere in the graphical view to jump to that spot**. When you find a correct location, **click the new index button**. This will create an index position which will appear in the menu in the lower left corner and will place a yellow/red line in the graphical view. Once you have all the index points made that you need **click the “split at index positions” button**. Your screen will look something like this:

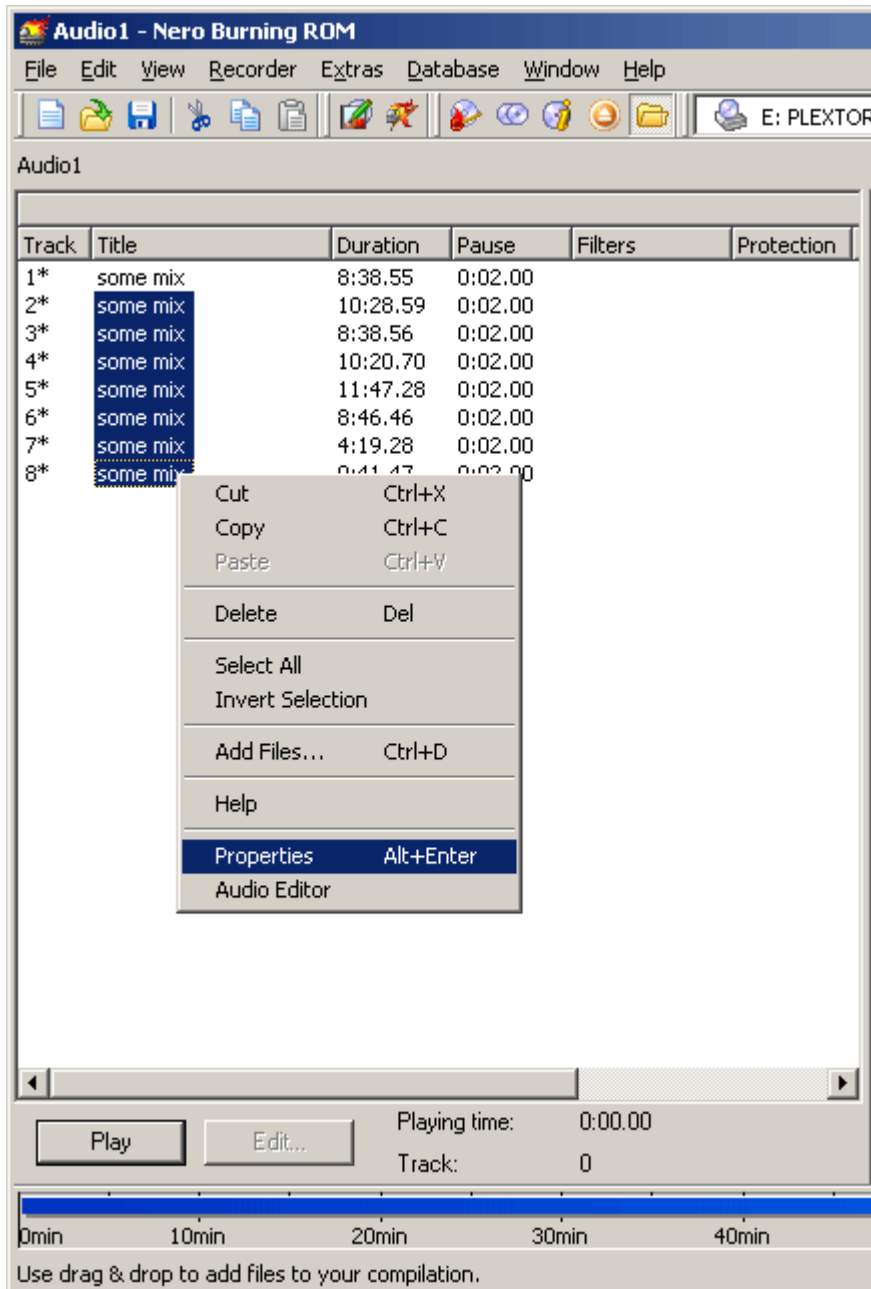


Click “ok” and a screen like this will pop-up:

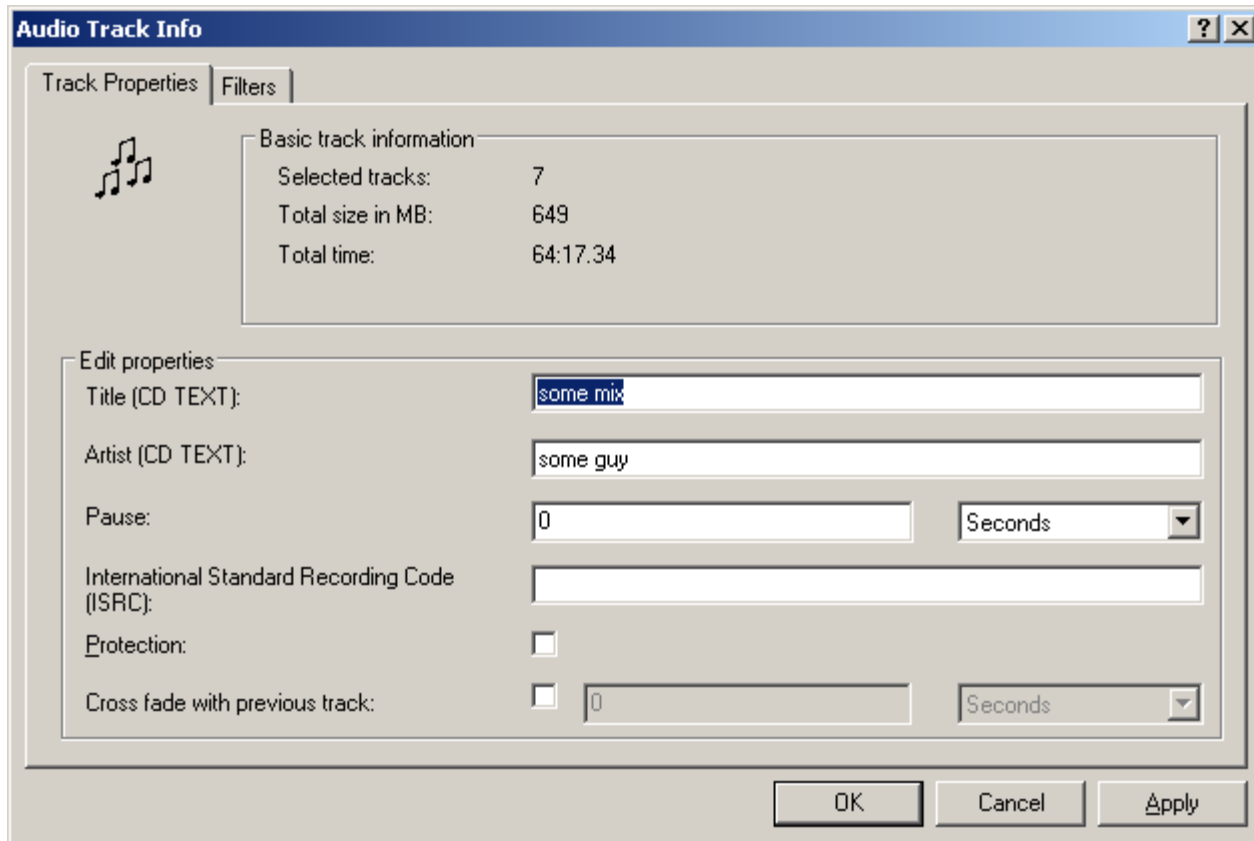


This is normal, **click “ok”** to continue.

4. **Select all of the “tracks”** created when you split up your mix **except the first** (as pictured) and **right click on one of the selected**. **Select “properties”**.

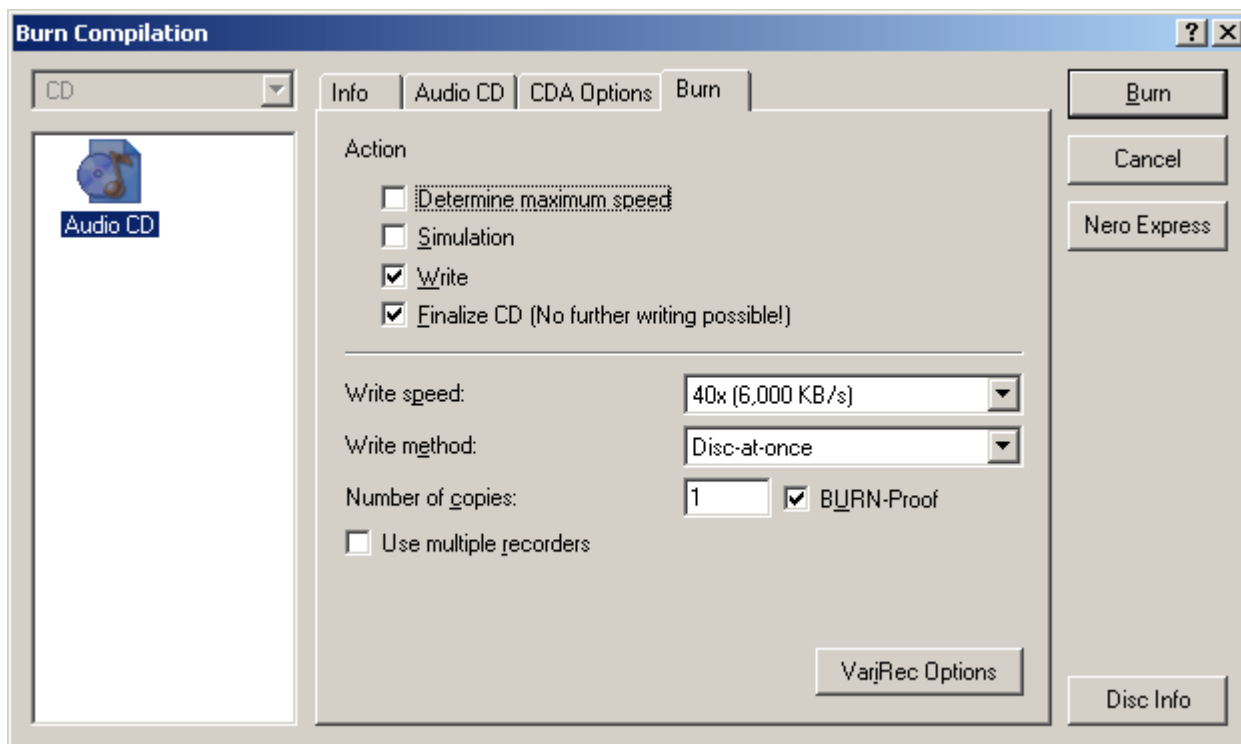


5. In the “**Track Properties**” tab (the one that pops up initially) there will be a **text field for “pause”** (midway down). **Change the 2 to a 0 (zero) and click okay.**



At this point if you are burning your CD with CD text and wish to have individual track names you need to select a track (a single track) and right click, select properties now rename your track.

6. Now you're ready to burn! **Click the burn button** and **make sure your settings are correct** (these can be different depending on the model of CD-burner you have), **always make sure that it will finalize the CD.** (It should look something like below) **Click burn and you're done!**
